from the desk of our FSA Executive Coordinator Fr Stephen Bliss OFM



Welcome to 2022 and our first newsletter for the FSA Year of **EMBRACE**. In our Franciscan tradition the concept of embrace is deeply rooted in the Gospel. For example, St. Francis and his companions start living the First Beatitude of Jesus in earnest, and their life together starts looking like the Kingdom of God on earth, thus fulfilling Jesus' words, "How blessed are the poor in spirit, the kingdom of heaven is theirs" (Mt 5:3). Jesus tells us that the kingdom of heaven *is* theirs, and it is also ours, here and now. We are invited to open the door of our heart to listen to the voice of Jesus this year. In **EMBRACING** a culture of encounter, we will create united and reconciled communities within a united and reconciled world.

The Pope of Fratelli Tutti, recently affirms this concept. In Mosul he said "Fraternity is more durable than fratricide". He reminds us that on that bridge, called humanity, we must all take steps in order to **EMBRACE** one another. And we must do so above all in order to embrace those who are furthest away, those who at first, we might find repulsive, because however distant they may be from us, they are still our brothers and sisters.

I pray that your community will set out each day to **EMBRACE** the God of all and that our Franciscan spirituality is s continuing inspiration. Fr Stephen

ST. FRANCIS MEETS A LEPER (pg 26) In the soft mists over the valley of Spoleto, Francis meets a leper. Sliding off his horse and walking unsteadily towards the woman, Francis says aloud "..., I see Jesus offering me the beautiful feminine hand." (pg 27)

Francis only knows this woman in a brief embrace. Only when his love grew strong enough to embrace what he found difficult would Francis see the light of the broken person in his arms.



Today, I realise that God's face will continue to allude us until, like Saint Francis, we embrace God in every creature. Fr Murray reminds us that "A joy-filled life comes from taking what is bitter in life and embracing it for the love of Jesus Christ, who in turn transforms it into sweetness of soul." In that difficult embrace between Francis and the leper, we learn that God's face is both masculine and feminine, and God's face is not always beautiful at first embrace. When we read how St. Francis embraced a leper and realised he had held God in his arms; we begin to remember repulsive, difficult times in our own lives that turned out somehow divine. As communities who embrace the Franciscan tradition we have to return again and again to the poor, the despised and rejected. Those things, people who and daily events that challenge us, and at first we despise. We live our calling when we embrace and accompany the *poor little* ones as Saint Francis did. Alison Stone

THE FRANCISCAN SPIRIT OF EMBRACE

St. Francis used to say that he and the brothers had a contract with the world. If the brothers were faithful to Gospel poverty, the people of God would care for their needs.

(see the tale of St Dominic and the Chapter of Mats)

Not everyone can live as poorly as St. Francis and the early friars did, but we can all live Gospel poverty which entails loving those who are not easily loved. In loving what we find difficult to embrace, we are transformed, our thinking is turned around, and we find God present in our community.

So, how do we do this daily in a busy school environment?

FSA encourages all member schools to enact these actions of embrace:



- Keep eyes on your loving God. Lead meetings and start ALL classes not just RE with a simple prayer or reflection. It can be two lines long @
 - Turn on your camera when on screen we want to SEE you!
 - Check in with everyone before you begin a meeting Use the traffic light
 - analogy..."How are you travelling? On a green road, waiting/ stalled on amber or on a red (rough) road?
 - Invite others to sit at 'your table' don't leave anyone on the outer, especially visitors and relief staff.
 - Actively seek out service opportunities in your local community.
- Embrace the ethos of sharing so share resources, experiences and yourself with others, especially those staff members you find 'bitter'.
 - Notice melancholy and respond warmly.
- Understand we don't let students go because they are disrespectful and difficult –
 this is when we embrace the bitterness.
 - Create a Franciscan inspired signature block. Add Pax et bonum or peace and all good or pace e bene or simply peace.
 - Acknowledge the local indigenous people whose country do you work on?
 - Go sit in nature and walk quietly upon the earth.
 - Enthusiastically schedule silence and stillness during your day.

These actions are a good start. But ...


